This role will teach our residents basic (or not so basic) sewing and clothes making or repairing skills. This role will also support the Leederville Fabric project, a community bunting project that showcases community-made bunting at the Leederville Carnival in December.

Taking part in our weeknight or weekend class, you will help our residents work out how best to reuse, remake, or restyle their clothes and fabrics, helping to use more of what they buy and reduce waste.
